FROM THE READER...

As I sit down to write this, we are approaching Pentecost the occasion where the Holy Spirit descends on the disciples causing them to speak in tongues. One of the readings that is traditionally associated with Pentecost includes the following verses from the Gospel of John:

'On the last day of the festival, the great day, while Jesus was standing there, he cried out, "Let anyone who is thirsty come to me, and let the one who believes in me drink. As the Scriptures has said, 'Out of the believer's heart shall flow rivers of living water.'"

Bishop Tom Wright, in his writings on this passage, tells us about his journey to the Middle East to view the location where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered. He explains that his host was anxious for all in his party, making sure they drank enough water during the trek. They were told "A pint of water every hour, and don't forget!". Tom, coming as he did from a cool and damp climate, explains how easy it can be to forget how important it was to drink plenty of water.

He goes on to say, that in that kind of climate all sorts of things in the Bible suddenly make sense. Most of the Bible, after all was written in the Middle East, where much of the land is desert and water is quite simply the number-one requirement wherever you go. If a town or tribe has a good water supply, from a stream or a spring or well, it can thrive; if it hasn't, it can't.

To people living in this area during the time Jesus was preaching, 'Living Water' was the regular way of referring to running water. Very simply water equalled life. Jesus is therefore saying that anyone that drinks from him will have eternal life.

The events of Pentecost laid out in Acts 2 v 1-13; talk about a rushing wind encompassing the Disciples and how they become filled with the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit filling them up, flowing through them and out of them gifted them with the spiritual life and security to spread the message to people of all nations and cultures, bearing whatever dangers and fears they came across on the way. Indeed, some went to their death with the gift of the Holy Spirit flowing forth from them.

The gift of the Holy Spirit is one only Jesus can give but it is a gift worth waiting for! Even the Disciples had to wait for the gift Jesus promised.

I genuinely believe that our faith in Christ fills us with the Holy Spirit. God has a plan for each one of us to allow the Living Water to keep flowing, bubbling up within us and overflowing to quench the spiritual thirst we find so readily in society today.



ESSENTIAL REQUIREMENTS:

- Have basic knowledge and use of publishing software of choice e.g. Microsoft Word.
- Experience using a high specification office printer with booklet and staple finishing capacity - the machine is situated at RSM.
- Be available at evenings and/or weekends to use the printer out of RSM Office hours.
- Compliance with the Magazine/RSM Printer ownership Agreement.
- Be able to keep unnecessary printing and paper wastage to a minimum.
- If you are not a member of St Denys' or St Mark's Church, you should be sympathetic to the Christian ethos and mission of the churches.

DESIRED REQUIREMENTS:

- Liaise with Magazine Editor, to advise church services and events taking place, including baptisms, wedding and funerals and who to name from the Book of Remembrance, for inclusion in the Magazine.

FAMILY SUPPORT WORK

Dear Friends,

Time is really flying by, and with the easing of lockdown rules last month we have been able to take cautious steps towards more normal ways of working. Our practitioners are still not able to visit families in their homes but have been meeting in outdoor venues, providing much-needed companionship and a chance to get out of the house. We have also been able to arrange some outdoor group sessions whilst continuing with virtual gatherings on Zoom or Facebook. It is now that the true impact of the pandemic on our families is becoming clear, with financial hardship and mental ill-health particular concerns, as well as the breakdown of relationships. We are expecting to receive many more new referrals over the coming weeks as schools, churches and other organisations become aware of families in need of our help.

We welcomed Gill Sutton to our team this week - Gill is our new family support practitioner for Rye, and she is looking forward to getting started and meeting local groups and individuals. Our other new practitioners will be joining at the start of June and we will let you know all about them in due course.

Our fundraising events have started up again, with a very busy calendar of Open Garden events over the coming months. Do take a look at the Events page on our website for all the details. I am also delighted to announce that our Amberley-Arundel sponsored walk is taking place again this year after an enforced break last year - please contact fundraising@familysupportwork.org.uk for information. We would love to see as many of you as possible taking part and helping us to raise vital income.

A REFLECTION

On 18 January 2008 Yvonne Kennedy watched what she describes as a "wonderful programme", namely

BBC 2's Natural World:

'Earth Pilgrim - a Year on Dartmoor'

Advertised as: "This exquisitely photographed film sees world-renowned ecologist and former Jain monk Satish Kumar exploring the ancient woods and rivers of Dartmoor through the changing seasons, revealing and reflecting on a wealth of wildlife including red deer, emperor moths, kestrels and foxes."

Satish Kumar says: "Trees give pleasure to a pilgrim like me I am sitting under a tree and the tree is a temple to the earth. My mother said: "A tree is a true teacher of humanity, even greater than Buddha". I said to my mother, "How can you say that?" and she said "Even the Buddha got his enlightenment sitting under a tree". People don't sit under trees now, [however] they have a sense of calm and healing.

His prayer:

*Lead me from death to life, from falsehood to truth
Lead me from despair to hope, from fear to trust
Lead me from hate to love, from war to peace
Let peace fill our hearts, our world, our universe

Harry has had work published in the UK and abroad, including the strip 'Clare in the Community' which has been a weekly feature in The Guardian since 1996. In 2016 he was awarded Strip Cartoonist of the Year by the UK Cartoon Trust. He then adapted the Guardian strip into a Radio 4 sitcom.

He is also a Sony Award winning writer of radio comedy, including the shows 'Coach Karen's Half Time Team Talk' and 'Clare in the Community' starring Sally Phillips, currently recording its twelfth series.

For the last ten years Harry has been performing his cartoon workshop 'Release Your Inner Cartoonist' in its many different guises, to audiences as diverse as schoolchildren, business executives and festival goers. However, Harry can't draw hands or horses!

Harry Venning has been a professional cartoonist for thirty years, during which time he has provided cartoons for several high profile UK publications (The Guardian, Radio Times) as well as for countless more obscure titles (British Journal Of Wound Care).




SPEEDWATCH

NUS GHANI MP
WEALDEN'S
VOICE IN
WESTMINSTER**



To mark International Women's Day, I reflected on my pride of representing Wealden as its first female MP and being the first female Muslim Minister to speak at the Commons despatch box. I can now proudly say that I am also the first Wealden MP to be sanctioned by the Chinese Communist Party, merely for carrying out my duties as an elected representative and standing up for democracy.



On 26 March, I woke up to find that alongside several other parliamentary colleagues, I had been banned from entering China, had any assets in China frozen (not that I have any there), and Chinese citizens and institutions had been prohibited from doing business with me. All because I have voiced well-evidenced concerns about the persecution of the Uyghurs at the hands of the Chinese state.

If the Chinese Communist Party (CCP) think that these sanctions will silence me, they made a serious miscalculation. Their reaction only proves that my work is having an impact. Free and open debate is at the heart of our parliamentary democracy and we will not allow foreign powers to intimidate democratically elected Members of Parliament and undermine it. Many of you have written to me with lovely words of support, for which I am very thankful. I appreciate that you have put your faith in an independent-minded MP who doesn't back down to bullies even if they are as powerful as the CCP.

Many of you have also previously written to me and urged me to stand up to China and its abusive behaviour. I am grateful to you for electing me as your representative in Westminster and I will continue to use my freedom to shine a light on China's activities. Since then, I successfully led a historical motion calling on Parliament to agree that the Uyghurs are facing genocide. In a momentous step, the motion was backed and Parliament unanimously declared a genocide for the first time in its history.

In the 75 years since the Nuremberg trials, neither the UN nor the UK has succeeded in recognising a genocide whilst it was ongoing. I am proud to have secured huge advances for human rights abuses and genocide around the world. The unanimous vote in Parliament will trigger a number of other events around the globe. I am already working with several parliamentarians from other countries who will now hold the same debate. Our hard-won parliamentary democracy will always stand up for what is right and remain free from foreign interference.

Since 2015, Nus has been a Dementia Friend, an initiative run by Alzheimer's UK. She previously chaired the All-Party Parliamentary Group for Older People and launched the Sussex Elders' Commission report in 2016 which addressed safety for older people. Nus has long been working with Rotherfield St Martin and she is fully supporting the charity in this project and has signed the Dementia Charter herself.

Nusrat Ghani said: "I am immensely proud of all our wonderful carers in Wealden who provide a better quality of life for people suffering from dementia. Rotherfield St Martin are a fantastic local charity and are selflessly dedicating their time to supporting our elderly and vulnerable. With over 10,000 people living with dementia in East Sussex, we must make sure that we do our bit to ensure that those people and their families feel safe and understood by the community. I am proud that Wealden is leading the way in making our communities dementia friendly and I am fully supporting RSM in this project. I have proudly signed up to the Dementia Charter and I hope many businesses and organisations will follow suit."
